
CANDY CANE GOSPEL

SHEPHERD'S STAFF...

Jesus is the Good Shepherd.

RED STRIPES...

The candy cane holds deep symbolic meaning, starting with its shape, which resembles a shepherd's staff. As Jesus says in John 10:14, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me." The red stripe on the candy cane represents the blood Jesus shed to forgive our sins, echoing Romans 5:8: "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." The need for this forgiveness is underscored in Romans 3:23: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

The white candy symbolizes the forgiveness of sins and a clean heart, as 1 John 1:9 reminds us: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Finally, when the candy cane is turned upside down, it forms a "J" for Jesus. To begin a relationship with Him, Romans 10:9 instructs us: "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."
